WORD STUDY: Cling



definition to adhere as if glued firmly; to hold or hold on tightly or tenaciously; to have a strong emotional attachment or dependence; to remain or linger as if resisting complete spreading or scattering (MW)

ADHERE + HOLD TIGHTLY

- It's a choice: You choose to glue yourself firmly to something; holding tightly takes effort.

- We are so insecure: we're afraid it can be taken away. Why else would we

TACHMENT/DEPENDENCE

- We end up forming a strong emotional attachment.
- We think we can't survive without this thing!

MPLETE SCATTERING

It's as if we think that, if this thing we want disappears we will just go POOF and disseminate.

> deeper look The Hebrew word "dabaq", translated "cling" in the ESV, is "cleave" in the KJV

cleave // follow hard // keep fast // abide // pursued // take in other places in the KJV.

cling to the LORD done to this day.'

things I cling to

why i should change

God commands it. "You shall follow the LORD your God and fear Him . . . keep His commandments, listen to His voice, serve Him, and *cling to Him.*" Deuteronomy 13:4 ((See also: Deuteronomy 6:5) "But you are to cling to the LORD your God." Joshua 23:8a
